## Just before the fall of Judah (586 BCE)

Jeremiah (627—571 BCE)  
Ezekiel (593-586 BCE)

## After the fall of Judah

Ezekiel (593-586 BCE)  
Second Isaiah: 40-55 (538 est. BCE)

Obadiah (After 586 BCE)  
*Against Edom*

## After the Return from Exile

Haggai (520 BCE)  
First Zechariah: 1-8 (after 538 BCE)  
Third Isaiah: 56-66 (after 538 BCE)  
Malachi (516-330 est. BCE)  
Joel (516 BCE or later)  
Jonah (Wisdom literature) - not a historical prophet

## Against Greek Empire / Occupation

Second Zechariah: 9-14 (after 332 BCE)  
Daniel (Wisdom literature) - set in Babylon
